Latham was the Head Baseball coach at Douglas County HS in 1985 and 86. He was selected the 1985 "**Rocky Mountain News Baseball High School Coach of the Year**". That year he led his team to its first ever winning baseball season in the schools 30 year history. The team also won their first ever "District Title" and State Tournament Berth. Latham was also selected to coach a "Colorado High School Select All Star Team" in 1985 to play in Australia for 13 days. His 1985 Summer Legion A team finished 3rd in State. In 1986 Latham won the "Skyline League Championship", second straight "District Championship and State Tournament" berth making it to the quarterfinals. The 1986 team set a "New School Record" for baseball wins of 16 for the high school season. In both 1985 & 1986 Latham was selected to coach the Skyline League Senior "All Star" Team in the "Senior Metro All State Baseball" games at Englewood, HS. While at Douglas County HS Latham won over 130 games winning at a .629 clip in two years of Spring and Summer play. He coached 4 players that were named to "Colorado All State" teams and 10 players selected to "1st Team All Skyline League" while at Douglas County.

Latham moved on to be the Head Coach at Otero Jr. College where he transformed its program into a "National Power" for the 1988 to 1991 seasons. He was named for two consecutive years the 1988 and 1989 "**Region IX National Jr. College Athletic Association (NJCAA) "Baseball Coach of the Year"**" as recognized by the "American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA)". Latham's teams were ranked in the "National NJCAA Top 25 Baseball Poll" each year reaching the highest ranking ever for the school 6th in 1989.
